WHEREAS, Moebius Syndrome is a rare neurological condition that affects one or more cranial nerves, often resulting in facial paralysis, limited eye movement, and challenges with speech and swallowing; and

WHEREAS, Individuals living with Moebius Syndrome, including Megan Brown of Lebanon, Kentucky, demonstrate remarkable strength, courage, and determination in overcoming these daily challenges; and

WHEREAS, Raising awareness about Moebius Syndrome helps promote understanding, inclusion, and compassion for those living with visible and invisible differences; and

WHEREAS, January 24, 2026, marks the 15th anniversary of Moebius Syndrome Awareness Day, a global observance dedicated to education, advocacy, and unity among individuals and families affected by this rare condition; and

WHEREAS, Recognizing Moebius Syndrome Awareness Day encourages communities throughout the Commonwealth to celebrate diversity and support Kentuckians living with rare disorders; and


